SUPPORT AT HOME

GOVERNMENT ASSESSMENT & FUNDING LEVELS

> When you register with My Aged Care, the Government will assess your needs. If eligible, you will receive one of 8 levels of funding.

FIND YOUR HOME CARE **PROVIDER**

> When the funding arrives, you will find a Home Care Provider to help you get the care that you need and manage your program.

SUPPORT PLAN CREATION

A Support Plan will be created to determine what services you will receive. Services fall under 3 categories.

QUARTERLY FUNDING ALLOCATION

> Funding will be allocated on a quarterly basis.

Q1 Jan - Mar \$3,995.42

Q3 July - Sept \$3,995.42

Q2 Apr - June \$3,995.42

Q4 Oct - Dec \$3,995.42

Example based on Support at Home Level 2 funding as at 1/09/2025.



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BUDGET BREAKDOWN & CONTRIBUTIONS

10% of funding is set aside for Care Management.

You may pay contribution fees based on service categories and income assessment.

You will also be asked to undertake an income test assessment. If you earn above a certain income threshold, you will make a higher contribution rate.

Level 8 Funding Example


(Annual funding \$77,709)

Quarterly Government Funding	\$19,427
Less 10% for Provider Care Management	\$1,943
Remaining to spend for 3 months	\$17,484

Service Category	Government Contribution	Your Contribution
Clinical Supports	\$8,000	\$0
Independence	\$4,750	\$250
Everyday Living	\$3,300	\$700
Surplus	\$1,434	

QUARTERLY ROLLOVER CALCULATION

Every 3 months, \$1,000 or 10% of unspent funds (whichever is higher) will roll over to the next quarter.



• \$1,434 unspent → \$1,000 rolls over

• \$11,000 unspent → \$1,100 rolls over (10%)
